- Elana requested support with organizing activities, especially the upcoming BBQ. She plans to go through the storage unit beforehand, as there are items stored she was unaware of. Anyone willing to help go through storage is welcome to join.
- There will be water activities at the BBQ—if anyone has water guns to donate, please let Elana know. Also, side dishes are encouraged.
- For Unity Day Campout, there will be a planning meeting on June 28 at 12:00 PM at the Mingus campground. Elana asked for help from anyone with experience organizing campouts, as additional support and fresh ideas are needed. She emphasized the need to encourage newer members to step up and get involved in service to strengthen fellowship and participation.

H&I Chair: James S:

- Orientation packets and current guidelines will remain as-is due to a lack of support for revisions at this time.
- H&I is currently seeking more volunteers for sponsorship within the jails. There are four open coordinator positions, currently being covered by temporary fill-ins.
- A new treatment facility in Mayer is opening in July. H&I plans to coordinate with PR to ensure a proper presentation is conducted when reaching out.

- **Kevin:**

Kevin emphasized how valuable this would have been before he took on a GSR role and encouraged everyone to **share this information with their homegroups**. The event will be held at Granite Creek Park. (This is the BBQ event coming up June 22nd and the GSR training will take place at 11:00am.)
- Kevin also mentioned he plans to set aside time to go with John to the Regional Service Committee meeting to gain more knowledge.

Ad Hoc Committee (Guidelines Review):

- The committee met on May 18 to review the guidelines and is currently waiting on Dave to send the modified documents for further discussion.

NEW BUSINESS:

Motion & Budget Discussion – BBQ Funding

Brief Summary:

A motion was introduced to allocate \$200 for BBQ food due to rising costs but was later withdrawn. Instead, groups were encouraged to bring potluck dishes. A new motion was made and seconded to increase the monthly Activities budget to \$750, which will be taken back to homegroups for a vote. The following is the discussion that took place:

- A motion was introduced to allocate \$200 for BBQ food due to increased prices. The funds would go to the Activities Subcommittee.
- **Elana** explained the price increase and emphasized that GSRs are trusted servants who can vote on behalf of their groups. She apologized for the late request and shared concerns about the rising cost of food.
- **Vicki** reminded the group that any budget increase must be taken back to the groups.
- **Jessica** asked whether this was addressed in the Ad Hoc Guidelines Committee.
- **John** said it was discussed but was unsure of the outcome.
- **Mark** added that any unused funds would be returned.
- **Kevin** asked if there were any objections to voting on the motion now.
- **Trent** suggested that guidelines should remain in place for financial issues to go back to the groups, but an emergency vote could be done via group outreach by the end of the week. He recommended that future budget requests be more specific and include an itemized list of expenses, and that the overall Activities budget may need to be increased long-term.
- **Annette** suggested that since the BBQ is donation-based, some supplies could be bought using donations collected at the event.
- **Kelly** proposed that each group contribute extra to help fund events, and that groups could set aside "seed money" for future activities.
- **Kevin** requested that groups return votes by noon next Sunday and that GSRs send results to Jess (Secretary).
- **Annette** voiced concern about how to notify groups that were not present.
- **Tim** questioned the difference between reaching out to groups via phone or email vs. voting at Area, arguing that GSRs are trusted to act on behalf of their groups.
- **Vicki** explained that the reason over-budget items go back to groups is because this is a service committee, and group involvement is important.
- **Annette** shared that GSRs can sometimes misrepresent their group's conscience.
- **Tim** countered that if GSRs can't act on behalf of their groups, events may need to be canceled.
- **Elana** responded that she wasn't trying to create controversy, only to address the increased cost of food. She agreed to withdraw the motion and work with the current budget.
- **Caprice** encouraged GSRs to take back to their homegroups that the BBQ is a potluck and that each group should bring a dish.
- **Vicki** then proposed a new motion to increase the monthly Activities budget to \$750.
- **Annette** seconded the motion.
- **Kevin** closed by reassuring the group that things generally work out, and that while it's normal to stress about planning, the events will likely come together. He acknowledged that further budget and policy clarification is still needed in the Ad Hoc committee and emphasized the importance of validating everyone's voice.

OPEN FORUM:

John: Shared that both he and Trent tried to recall what was discussed at the recent Ad Hoc meeting. He reflected on how, in the past two years, there were even more difficult discussions, but things moved forward because the Activities Chair at the time was strong and flexible. He noted that without a verbal emergency clause, many events wouldn't have happened. John emphasized that GSRs are elected to carry their group's conscience and that homegroups can establish their own guidelines for how GSRs vote at Area. He expressed concern that the process is being made unnecessarily complicated, adding that expecting the Activities Chair to plan months in advance is unrealistic. He reiterated that subcommittee chairs are trusted servants elected to do their jobs and emphasized the importance of focusing on the fellowship's singleness of purpose rather than getting caught up in procedural delays.

Shawna: Expressed feeling torn, stating that while she may have one opinion at Area, members of her homegroup might vote differently when she brings the motion back to them.

John: Asked how many GSRs currently have a complete homegroup.

Trent: Asked for clarification on what "complete" means.

John: Responded that technically, it only takes two members to vote, but noted that some GSRs come from groups with too few or no active members, making it difficult to carry a group conscience. He shared that a GSR once had to abstain from voting for that reason.

Kevin: Thanked everyone for sharing their perspectives and emphasized that hearing different opinions helps keep the committee accountable.
