Subcommittee Reports

Activities Chair: Elana:

Reported that the campout will be held next weekend. A sample of this year's hoodies was presented; colors include maroon and camo, priced at \$40 each. Approximately 40 hoodies are available in a mixture of sizes, including a few small and medium.

- **Meals & Coordination:** Verde Valley group will provide breakfast; Area is handling dinner.
- **Parking/Shuttle:** Parking is limited. Attendees arriving Saturday must park in the lot and call numbers on the flyer for shuttle service. Those attending Saturday only may park across the street in the dirt lot, but overnight parking is not allowed.
- **Setup & Registration:** Registration will open Friday at 2:00 PM. Elana plans to arrive around 11:00 AM to unload the trailer and set up. Some members volunteered to help with Friday setup. Additional supplies will be pulled from storage on Thursday (3:00–3:30 PM) with volunteers needed.
- **Attendance:** Pre-registration currently stands at 21. Additional attendees are expected at the event, including a house from Cottonwood (12 members) and another house from the Area arriving Saturday.
- **Activities & Program:** Planned activities include a scavenger hunt for kids, bingo, and a speaker from California who will also bring alternate merchandise for auction and raffle. Members were asked to donate raffle/auction items.

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- **Other Notes:** Shopping for supplies was mostly completed last week. Fire restrictions have been lifted, allowing campfires Friday and Saturday, and firewood will be provided.

Additional Discussion:

- Trent asked about setup timing; members confirmed setup would begin Friday, though some may arrive Thursday.
- Tim asked whether registration covered food and camping. Elana clarified registration is per person, not per campsite.
- Arron noted volunteers are needed Thursday to help move supplies from storage, as he cannot arrive until after registration on Friday.

H&I Chair: James S:

Reported that all coordinators are currently in place, though some issues remain with DP, including uncertainty about whether a meeting has been canceled. James has been proactive in reaching out first to clarify.

- **Panel Participation:** H&I continues to struggle with finding members to serve on panels. Any member with available time, who has a sponsor and is actively working steps, is encouraged to participate.
- **Campout Presence:** H&I will have a table at the campout.
- **T-Shirt Contest:** Announced an H&I t-shirt contest.
- **Materials:** Binders will be replenished due to past disorganization.
- **Meetings:** Journey facility now requires badges. The next subcommittee meeting is scheduled for the 7th.
- **Coverage Issues:** Some facilities were not able to be upheld or requests met due to lack of volunteers. There is interest in expanding to Wickenburg in the future.

Discussion:

- Karen asked for clarification on “panels.” James explained that there is a list of facilities posted on the website where H&I panels are carried in.
- Josie asked how to join the panel list. James confirmed she is now on the list and that H&I maintains a calendar for scheduling.

PR: Aaron – Reported that PR attended Recovery Day yesterday, which had a great turnout. During the event, Aaron was able to donate a Basic Text to the raffle, which was well-received.

- **Upcoming Events:** On September 20 from 10:00 AM – 4:00 PM, PR will host a booth at Hope Fest. Members are encouraged to attend and support.
- **Subcommittee:** Next PR subcommittee meeting will be held tomorrow at 3:30 PM at the mall food court.
- **Phone Lines:** Volunteers are needed to help cover the phone line. Members interested should see Aaron after the meeting.

Discussion:

- Kevin asked if there is a sheet or script available. Trent noted it is included in the PR handout.
- Aaron clarified that when the phone line rings, it cycles through until someone answers. He invited members to bring questions after the meeting or attend the subcommittee.

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- Dave expressed concern about not knowing if he was still on the phone list. Aaron advised members to speak with him directly to confirm.

Merchandise Chair: Aleena L.

We attended the SEAZNAC convention and sold a total of 9 garments! I sold another shirt outside of that, and I will be turning in \$280.00 this month. I am hoping to get a spot at NACONA for alternative merch. I will ask questions regarding that. Outreach: OPEN

NACONA – Mo

Expressed gratitude for being present and noted overall concerns about lack of member involvement and willingness to serve. Reported that while some positions have been filled, there continues to be significant struggle in finding support.

- **Convention Status:** NACONA is currently short 91 room nights for its hotel contract. The committee is already committed to spending approximately \$10,000 on food but is uncertain whether they will be able to cover the room night requirement.
- **Future Concerns:** There has been considerable discussion about the possibility of not holding a convention next year if funds are depleted this year.
- **Registrations:** Current registration stands at 51, which is low.
- **Speakers:** Confirmed that this year's speakers are excellent and highly anticipated.
- **Follow-Up:** Committee members have been making phone calls to verify contact information for outreach. Mo stated, "We are going to have an event, and it is in God's hands."

Old Business:

Motion/Discussion: Consolidating Area and Subcommittee Meetings

A motion was carried to bring back to homegroups the idea of moving Area and consolidating all subcommittee meetings so they are held on the same day.

Homegroup Feedback & Member Input:

- Vickie (homegroup report): Her group discussed the pros and cons. They did not feel combining meetings on Sundays would increase participation, as many addicts already have obligations. Suggested the possibility of holding all subcommittee meetings earlier in the day on a Saturday, so they do not interfere with evening meetings. Supported the idea of including food to encourage attendance.
- Carlos: Believed subcommittees should decide their own meeting times/locations.

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- Jacob: Felt that holding all meetings in one day could discourage newcomers by being too long.
- Kevin: Questioned how many newcomers are currently involved.
- Trent: Stated subcommittees thrive when they choose their own times. His group had no discussion but he provided input.
- Bailey: Supported some consolidation with breaks in between and food provided, suggesting renting a space from 9:00 AM–4:00 PM.
- John: Suggested hosting a Learning Day event (similar to GSR training) to introduce subcommittees, with food and fellowship, to spark newcomer interest and provide a pathway to service.
- Annette: Her group felt the Area should be open to trying new approaches, even if they don't work long-term. Encouraged acting in faith, not fear, and making service more accessible.
- James: Emphasized diversity and the importance of direct invitations to attend subcommittees. Shared his experience that sponsorship often brings members into service. Encouraged ongoing announcements to remind members that all are welcome.
- Paul: His group was hesitant about combining meetings in one day but was open to forming an ad-hoc to explore further.
- Jessica: Raised concerns about childcare being a barrier for parents, sharing that single parents in particular struggle to attend Area without support.
- Annette: Shared that in her region, childcare was offered during consolidated meetings.
- Kevin: Suggested exploring Park Collective as a potential meeting location, noting they don't hold services on Sundays.

Outcome:

- General agreement that more exploration is needed before making a final decision.
- An ad-hoc committee will be formed to research potential locations and schedules, including the possibility of holding consolidated meetings on Saturdays, with considerations for food and childcare.

OPEN FORUM:

Vice Treasurer Discussion

- Josie asked what the clean time requirement is for the Vice Treasurer position, noting she has over two years and is interested.
- Members confirmed the requirement is listed in the Area Guidelines (available online).
- Bailey noted that not every committee needs a Vice Chair report and suggested it may be unnecessary at times. Recommended Josie consider running in 2026 and use the time between now and then to learn the role. Reminded members that resumes are due in October and November.
- Jessica (current Treasurer) shared that she intends to put in a statement of willingness for Treasurer next year, as she initially stepped into this role expecting to serve two years. Encouraged Josie to shadow and learn the responsibilities now, so she would be prepared when the time comes.
- Bailey further advised that the last quarter of the year is a good time for members considering service positions to sit with current trusted servants and observe how the role works.

Dave: Shared that there is a book available on Amazon titled *As the Journey Began: The History of NA in Arizona*, priced at \$30 online. Offered to lend a copy to anyone interested in borrowing it.
