Subcommittee Reports

ACTIVITIES CHAIR: John D:

I am grateful for those who attend Activities meetings. Our March event will be the Chili Cook-Off on the 29th in Prescott, and I ask that everyone please help share the flyer in meetings. We will have service commitments available at this event that still need to be filled. The prize for the Chili Cook-Off winner will be a one-of-a-kind apron and a registration for the Unity Day Campout. I also presented GSR orientation information for the April 18 event, the Back in Time Bash, and there is a flyer available. H&I and PR will be hosting a BBQ and Hawaiian-themed event on May 30, and I encourage everyone to contribute and support that event. In June, we are planning an outdoor event, and the campout is scheduled for September 18–20.

Dave: I also want to share that when I receive a flyer, I automatically send it to Region as well.

We have reached out to facilities and received a good response from Stoneridge, and they would like to get residents to the event. The idea of having a Bahama Bucks snow cone truck was also suggested, though I am not yet sure how that would fit in with everything else. We need support to help make these events successful.

H&I CHAIR: Mark:

H&I is doing much better than it has in the past. We had some people step up last month, and I believe things are moving in the right direction. We are currently going into eight facilities, and we will be starting at Wolf Creek on the 17th. We will be going there every other week, alternating with Hillside. We are also working on new guidelines and orientation materials. We are trying to simplify the guidelines and get orientation packets prepared. We still need a secretary, as Bailey is feeling overwhelmed, and we need someone to step up and get involved. Our literature expense for this month was \$299.00.

I would also like to request that the remaining \$100 in our budget go toward toolkits and the upcoming event.

Mo: Do we need Regional support regarding the guidelines?

Bailey: I submitted the final version to Jess last night and asked members of our committee to send feedback. At this point, I think we need to move forward and submit it for approval because it has already gone through a lot of editing. We have done a great deal of work on it. One of the biggest changes involves how to get more people involved. We are hoping to implement a tier system where everyone completes orientation. Those with 6 to 18 months clean would complete three shadows, those with 18 months to 4 years would complete one shadow, and those with 4 or more years would only need orientation. Everyone would still be considered on a case-by-case basis.

Our next meeting will be on March 29 at 9:00 a.m. at Third Shot, not Frannie's. If Third Shot is unavailable, we will meet in the food court at the mall.

For budget clarification, we have a monthly budget of \$400. We spent \$299 on literature, and with \$100 allocated toward toolkits, that brings the total to \$399.

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H&I VICE CHAIR: Bailey:

I took edits from a few people who gave feedback and have adjusted.

I did not see this email until right now, but Cassandra T submitted a lot of nice suggestions. She has been serving as the regional H&I secretary for a few years and is now the regional H&I vice chair.

My intention was to send these finalized at area tomorrow for approval and move on finally lol.

Should we add any of this for this year or keep them for a review in the future and continue with what has been completed so far and send out for review tomorrow.

MOTION: "Send \$250 to World on the months we don't do a regional donations (6x a year for a total of \$3,000).

DISCUSSION:

The discussion centered on whether Area should begin sending direct donations to World in the months it does not donate to Region. Members discussed the purpose of Area funds, the value of supporting World services directly, and concerns about whether the Area's current balance can realistically support that level of giving. Several members supported the idea of using excess funds to further carry the message, while others expressed concern about adding a recurring financial commitment with rising costs and upcoming Area needs. It was ultimately decided that the motion would need to be amended with more specific language before moving forward.

Janet: I thought we give to Region, and then Region donates to World.

Mo: There were individual members who donated a ton of money directly to World.

Annette: Region donated a lot of money last year due to the convention.

Janet: Why are we trying to do this?

John: I want GSRs to really look at this motion.

Trent: It makes sense to me that if other Areas around the world are giving money directly to World, why would we not put some directly toward World too? We have the money. We can give more to help carry the message. Why not show that our Area is growing by donating to World? We will get our name on the list.

Mo: We just did CAR and CAT, and all of those things cost money. In order for us to further the message not only in the states, but all over the world, it takes money for that to happen. If we are going to sit on money, that is not a good idea and not why people put money in the basket. If it is to further the message of NA, then we need to continue to send funds to carry the message at the World level. When we look at the totals, that amount helps, so let's help a little more.

Janet: Our Region donated \$23,000. Phoenix donated \$1,000 by themselves, and they are a larger Area. It was clarified that the total donations would be \$3,000 a year, including donations to Region. Region would receive \$250 on odd months, and the proposal would be for World to receive \$250 on even months.

Bailey: When people say we are sitting on money, I do not really consider that to be what we are doing. We have a low balance in general, and it is a lot lower than in previous years. I do not know why we would add another bill to our budget. We have events coming up that will require requests for money. Feeding our Area and growing our Area is important. I feel like \$3,000 is a lot for our Area.

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John: There are audit reports, and we have had an increase in literature costs too. We have raised this almost every year. I am not in a place where I can buy sponsees literature with the increase. GSRs, it is something to consider.

Trent: What we are talking about is realistic. But send it back to home groups to discuss whether to send the money or not. We should put it to work. If you think it will cut us short, then vote appropriately.

Kevin: My suggestion is to make it a total of \$2,000 instead of \$3,000 and make half go to Region and half go to World. We would still be donating, but it would not leave us short-handed.

Trent: That is another motion.

Bailey: That is a guideline change as well. When we have extra money, or think we do, I would suggest we donate at the next Area instead of making a \$250 every month commitment. We would be more apt to approve that motion.

Dave: If we put it in the guidelines and put it in this motion, and then we find ourselves at a lower balance, do we still have to donate money?

Annette: No.

Dave: If we put it in as a motion, it is not something we have to do every month depending on our funds?

Mo: The language in the guidelines matters.

Sean-Michael: If we want to have an open door or safety net, the motion will need to be reworded. If we pass this motion as it reads, we would be donating.

Outcome: It was decided that the motion would be amended with more specific language.

Sean-Michael: We do not know what costs are going to do over the course of the next year. We are seeing increases in other things. I want to make sure we are not hurting ourselves as an Area if we get spread too thin.

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Discussion:

The discussion focused on whether Area should alternate donations between Region and World when financially feasible. Members talked through the balance between supporting NA worldwide and making sure the Area keeps enough funds to support local growth, activities, and services. Some felt the Area should act from abundance and use available funds to further the message, while others emphasized the importance of protecting local resources and investing in Area growth. The overall sense was that everyone wants to carry the message, but there were different opinions on the best way to do that financially.

Jessica: Up to \$1,500 a year?

Josie: I would remove the \$1,500 amount so we do not have to set a limit.

Bailey: "When financially feasible" does change the vote for me. A direct amount is going to be more approvable.

Annette: At the end of every Area, we would look at the money we have and decide what we had available to send to Region or World. We would look at our funds and determine what could be sent. We do have money in this Area. How can we live in the theory of abundance? Have faith that more money will come in. Use the money we have for more good things. Do we need to get too caught up in the nuances?

Janet: At the home group level, we would need to know every other month before Area so we could vote on that, right?

It was clarified that the Treasurer's Report shows both incoming and outgoing funds, so there is a difference between what comes in and what remains at the end of the month. It was also noted that monthly totals can vary, with approximately \$400 to \$1,100 coming in each month, which makes it hard to predict exactly what will be available.

Kevin: We worry about money every single time, and we never seem to run out of money. I like the Field of Dreams theory. We do need to keep in mind that we have to give back to the addict who still suffers.

John: I agree with what you are saying. At the same time, almost every year we have had to ask for mega bucks to pull off Unity Day Campout. If we give the money away, we may not have the funds when we need them.

Expenses do not go down. We need more people. There are things we could do with that money that might be more attractive. H&I using money for water bottles is also getting our message out there. I would like to see us work on growth for our Area. Maybe one month we could look at the money we have and send some to World.

Vincent: I think anything above a certain amount in our account could be sent to Region. We could keep it tied to a certain amount that stays in the bank.

Bailey: Our Area needs more people. Activities gets people excited. It is attractive to people and gets them involved and wanting to be a part of something. I am in favor of enriching our Area with that money.

Annette: I think having strong home groups is important. I remember the message I received at the event, and we attract people based on the strength of the home group. Activities take money, but home group meetings do not take as much. The message is received by newcomers at the home groups. I felt more connection there than anywhere else. The home groups are where we carry the message.

John: I have a question for Annette and PR. How much were you planning on spending on billboards?

Annette: The first part of the year is for planning, and then we would look at specific fundraising events to support the spending. It is still in the idea stage. It may not even be a billboard. There are a lot of different options. Right now we are gathering ideas about what is out there, and then we would create a two- to three-year plan to make it happen.

Mo: There is also Regional support for these kinds of things, so we do not have to do it all on our own.

Kevin: We all have the passion to give back, and we just have different routes for getting there. Let's send this back to the groups and see what happens.

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NEXT MOTION: "Increase budget for activities in May to \$1000 from \$750 based on June 2024 Luau – Total spent was \$899.38 not including the \$85 Ramada fee. Discussion:

The discussion focused on the financial outcome of the previous Luau event and whether increasing the May Activities budget is reasonable. John shared that most of the event costs were nearly returned to Area and that attendance was strong, with 167 addicts present. Bailey noted that those results were achieved without an Activities Chair in place at the time, which made the current budget request seem more justified.

Kevin: How much came back to Area last year?

John: \$832.62 was returned to Area. We had 167 addicts in attendance. We did not receive any donations from treatment centers. The message was spread. Last year, we ordered food from a Hawaiian BBQ place.
