It was discussed that getting people to be of service for events has been a challenge. Members do not necessarily need to stay for the entire event, but help is needed. A sign-up sheet will be passed around for volunteers to sign up to help with upcoming events. There will also be follow-up with PR and H&I in the coming week or so to coordinate and determine next steps. It was also shared that a member of the NA community works at the Hawaiian BBQ place and offered to check whether they would provide any type of discount if the area used them for future events.

Key tags will be purchased and a \$28.00 literature purchase.

YASC MINUTES

Mo: Stated that last month there was discussion about doing a free newcomer event. It was suggested that this be discussed in conjunction with another event already being planned for next year. Mo shared that Girls Gone Clean and Lit on Saturday Night are interested in joining together to put on an event at the park for newcomers. She stated that there are a lot of newcomers showing up to meetings and that there needs to be a way to get treatment centers involved in being of service.

John: Stated that treatment centers are informed of the suggested donation, but that no one is turned away.

Mo: Clarified that this event would be specifically for the newcomer. She also mentioned that there is another event in June. She shared that when outreach was done for the chili cook-off, some treatment centers stayed to help and be of service. Mo stated that she believes they may want to help but may not know that help is needed.

Mo: Further clarified that the need is not only for service at events, but also service to NA at meetings. She suggested having a discussion at the event about how to be of service.

Kevin: Stated that the groups that want to help put the event on should show up to the subcommittee meeting.

John: Asked whether B&G people would want the event in Prescott Valley or another location.

Mo: Stated that there has not been much discussion about the location yet, only about the people who are willing to be involved.

Joe: Stated that most of the treatment centers are in Prescott, so logistically that may be something to consider.

Janet: Shared that some guys come in from a sober living house.

Mo: Stated that she does not think it is necessarily an issue of location.

The next subcommittee meeting has not been scheduled yet.

H&I CHAIR: Mark:

Really coming along. Doing a lot better. Getting more involvement. More than just showing up for Juvi. People are now more receptive than before. We still need more people to show up.

PR Position Statement of Willingness:

Guy spoke up and stated that he would like to take on the PR position. He provided his statement of willingness to serve.

Guy: Stated, "I do have a willingness to take PR. I am now handicapped due to loss of vision, and I cannot drive. However, I have people in the program who are willing to help with transportation. Nineteen years ago, I was elected as PI Chair, which was what it was called at that time, as this committee did not exist back then. After moving to Arizona, I served as PI Chair for Phoenix in 2013–2014. That is some of the experience I have. I have good PR materials, such as this map showing NA around the world. I have learned how to work with first responders. We found out that after spending \$600 on posters, a paramedic saw the poster and asked if we could put the information on business cards. I have quite a bit of experience in PR. On July 22nd, I will celebrate 23 years. I have been in service the whole time. I can be present for meetings and presentations. That is my willingness to take the PR position."

Old Business:

Little White Book Homegroup Discussion:

There was discussion regarding the Little White Book homegroup and when representatives are expected to be present at Area.

Mo: Asked when Little White Book is actually supposed to be present. Mo stated that she thought the representative had to attend Area in order for the meeting to be added to the meeting list. Since then, the representative has not attended Area.

Janet: Stated that it may be difficult for people to attend Little White Book because there are already other meetings taking place that night. Janet suggested that possibly due to the lack of participation, the representative may not be showing up. She suggested that he consider moving the meeting to another time.

Kevin: Stated that there is not currently a Saturday morning meeting and that if he sees the representative at a meeting, he will suggest that option.

Janet: Stated that the goal is to help get him support.

H&I subcommittee policies from last month:

NACONA Update:

Mo: Provided an update on NACONA. For the campout in August, there is currently one full registration and one Saturday-only registration. Mo stated that they do not yet know what to prepare for or what to purchase based on the current number of registrations. The campout will be held August 20–23. Flyers are available, and members were asked to please announce the campout during 12-step meetings.

For the NACONA Convention, there are currently 20 room nights booked, 13 full registrations, and 2 basic registrations.

Area Grill / Equipment Request:

John D.: Asked if NACONA could borrow the area's grill and other related items.

Mo: Stated that NACONA used the area's grill last year. She clarified that this is a request from the convention to Area. Last year, someone picked the grill up from storage and returned it afterward.

Annette: Stated that last year she made a motion from NACONA to Area stating that NACONA would replace anything that was broken. She shared that the grill was returned without any problems.

John D.: Stated that the knobs for the gas are broken, so he will need to look at it. He also stated that the grill may be used for the June event and that the goal is to get all of the area equipment cleaned up.

NEW BUSINESS:

PayPal Address Update Discussion:

Josie: Stated that she would like to change the address on the PayPal account from Dave's address to the area PO Box.

Dave: Stated that he was unsure whether a PO Box could be used for PayPal. He stated that if it is allowed, he has no issue with the change.

Josie: Stated that she will consult with Jessica, the treasurer, regarding the address change.

Regional Printer Discussion:

The area discussed whether to accept one of the donated high-end printers from Region before the May 30th deadline. Discussion included possible storage at Dave's house, accessibility for other counties, transportation, supply costs, maintenance concerns, and whether the printer would be cost-effective despite being free. No final decision was noted.

Mo: Stated that she would like to have input and discussion regarding the donated printers. The printers will be going somewhere else on May 30th if a location is not identified. Mo stated that there needs to be a location in Northern Arizona, and that Yavapai is somewhat central to Northern Arizona, which could make it a reasonable place to house the printers. She explained that the printers are full office-sized machines and would require a large space. They would also need to be available to all counties in the area. Discussion would also need to include how ink and paper would be supplied for the printers. Mo stated that Dave offered space at his house if Area chooses to move forward with this.

Kevin: Asked if all the different areas would have access to the printers and whether they would also contribute financially.

John: Asked if the printer is better than the one this Area currently has.

Dave: He shared that ink and supplies (for full office sized printers) may be very minimal over time, but he could not imagine some of the other areas driving to this area just to make copies. He also stated that Area already has access to a scanner and printer.

Stephanie: Asked if all four printers are looking for homes or if Region is considering sending them to other areas.

Mo: Stated that the printers are available to the whole state. She stated that she did not want Area to miss out on the opportunity to have one since it is free.

Annette: Stated that ink cartridges may cost approximately \$100–\$200 per color, and if drums go out, they may cost approximately \$200–\$500. She stated that the printer is far superior, but any maintenance on it could be very expensive. She also asked how the printer would be transported to this area.

Stephanie: Stated that someone has a truck.

Annette: Stated that even though the machine is free, it could still come with a significant cost.

Kevin: Asked about the possibility of keeping it at an NA clubhouse.

Dave: Stated that for the individual area, he already has a scanner, laser printer, and a nice color printer, and anyone is able to use it for NA printing. He stated that he does not mind housing the large printer in his garage, but the garage is warm and not air-conditioned. He stated that these are things to consider when deciding whether to take the printer.

Stephanie: Asked Mo if she would be willing to store it at her place.

Mo: Stated that she does not have the space for it anymore. She stated that if this is not something Area wants to participate in, that is fine, but the printer has to be moved by May 30th.

Karen: Stated that based on the discussion about maintenance, it may not be cost-effective to have the printer.

John: Asked if Region would still own the device.

Mo: Stated that the printers were donated to Region.

Sean-Michael: Stated that machines like this can cost thousands to rent or buy. He stated that if something goes wrong or toner is needed, it can become expensive, but what the printers are capable of may be worth it. He stated that if they are giving the printer away, it could be worth approximately \$4,000–\$6,000, and there may be future uses for it.

ARCNA Position Vote Discussion:

John: Stated that the Area needed to vote on ARCNA positions, including Chair, Vice Chair, and Treasurer. Region will meet next week, and that is when the final voting will take place. The following individuals submitted statements of willingness:

- Chair: Matthew M.
- Vice Chair: Dominic and Sharlene
- Treasurer: Matt P.

Statements of willingness were read for each candidate.

Annette: Stated that it is difficult to make a decision because the body does not personally know these individuals. She also stated that it can be difficult to bring this information back to groups and help others understand the importance of the vote.

The body discussed giving Mo a vote of confidence and allowing her to make the decision regarding the individuals running for these positions. Mo stated that she did ask the candidates questions about themselves.

A vote was taken to allow Mo to use her judgment when voting on these ARCNA positions at Region.

Vote: 9 yes, 0 opposed, 3 abstained.

The body agreed to trust Mo's decisions and votes regarding the ARCNA positions.

Treasurer / Activities Funds Discussion:

Josie: Asked if she needs to provide cash to Activities or anyone else.

John: Stated that money is given to him after it is deposited at the bank.

OPEN FORUM:

Burning Desires / Meeting Safety Discussion:

The body discussed concerns regarding a newer member who shared violent ideations during burning desires, which caused some members and treatment center clients to feel uncomfortable returning to the meeting. Discussion focused on whether burning desires should remain in the meeting format, how to support members who share alarming content, and how to maintain a safe and welcoming meeting environment. Several members expressed that burning desires should not be removed, but that trusted servants may need to lovingly intervene, follow up with the individual, review the meeting format, and use group conscience to decide how to handle similar situations moving forward.

Annette: Shared that a newer member from a treatment center shared violent ideations during burning desires. She clarified that they were not direct threats toward anyone in the meeting, but were related to what the member was personally going through. The share brought up a lot of feelings for people in the meeting. Annette stated that the group is split between keeping burning desires in the format or removing it and asked how other groups have handled similar situations.

Vincent: Stated that there may be an IP related to violent and disruptive behavior.

Annette: Stated that the IP does not directly address this specific situation because there was not a direct threat toward anyone in the meeting. The comments were directed toward people outside of the meeting.

Guy: Shared that he was present during the meeting. He stated that the member talked about wanting to kill someone at a place where his family member worked, but that it appeared to be anger directed at the past. Guy stated that he did not observe anything psychotic. He shared that a tech from a treatment center later spoke with him and said some of the women from the center were scared to return to the meeting because of the share. Guy stated that he personally felt the situation was blown out of proportion. He stated that NA polices itself and that he has never seen anyone hurt or attacked at meetings. He shared that burning desires has been part of meetings since the beginning of his recovery and that it exists because addicts were dying and needed a chance to talk and express their feelings. Guy stated that burning desires should not be removed when a person is not making direct threats. He acknowledged that people may have felt threatened, but stated that no one was actively threatened. He also disagreed with the suggestion that the treatment center be told not to allow the member back, stating that burning desires is necessary.

Kevin: Stated that the member may have been vulnerable and needed to get it out. He stated that someone at the meeting is supposed to approach the member and talk with them afterward.

Joe: Stated that the member was approached but was closed off, did not want to talk, and left.

Annette: Shared that she spoke with the member recently and was able to talk with him. She suggested that he pull someone aside individually in the future and also discussed with him how other members may have been triggered. Annette stated that she mainly wanted suggestions on how other groups handle burning desires. She stated that she believes the situation with the member has been resolved and that she does not believe burning desires should be removed.

Sean-Michael: Shared that he has had to step in when things begin going off track or when someone starts taking over the share. He stated that he tries to lovingly and kindly interject by saying something such as, "I would love to talk to you after the meeting," or, "It seems like there is a lot going on here, and I would hate to see you run off." He stated that the response should come from a compassionate place and that time should be made for the individual. Sean-Michael stated that he has handled similar situations before and that he tries to make an effort to talk with the person before they leave. He stated that he would never tell someone that their burning desire share is wrong because that could make them feel ostracized or like they do not belong.

YASC MINUTES

Karen: Stated that she agrees burning desires should not be removed. She noted that the person could have shared the same content during a regular share. Karen stated that anytime someone shares something alarming, members should surround them with love and care. If the person is closed off, then they are closed off. She stated that whether the share occurs during burning desires or regular sharing is not the main issue.

Sean-Michael: Stated that it does not matter where the share happens. He shared that some meetings include an announcement asking members to keep shares to 3–5 minutes and emphasizing that if something is really wrong, members can ask how they can help. He stated that he is not afraid to interrupt someone if needed, although he is sure people have judged him for doing so. He also stated that he went to the member afterward. He emphasized the importance of being available to someone and focusing on what will benefit the most.

Dave: Stated that he is in favor of helping the addict, but if someone shares about violently killing young women and that share drives out multiple newcomers, it needs to be addressed in multiple ways. He stated that the individual needs to be talked to and helped, but keeping multiple people from leaving the meeting is also important. Dave stated that if his share drove multiple people away, that would be an issue that should be addressed. He stated that he does not know how to resolve the concern while keeping burning desires, but believes it needs to be looked at.

Mo: Asked how meetings can continue to be appealing and welcoming to all members. She suggested considering whether an additional statement could be added to the meeting format regarding the intent to maintain a safe meeting for everyone. Mo stated that she is glad the member was able to express himself, but also questioned what should be done about the treatment center that may not return to the meeting. She stated that this is an issue and that a conversation needs to be held.

Karen: Stated that NA's primary purpose is to share the message. She stated that there is no quick fix when something unexpected happens and that groups should do the best they can based on the Traditions.

John G.: Shared a coping suggestion and referenced the Traditions. He stated that autonomy is what protects the groups and that each group can do what it wants to do. He noted that groups vary. Jon stated that when a problem arises, the group should look at what it is doing and take a group conscience. He stated that a group is only as strong as its members and that if someone is placed in the chair position, they need to be able to handle what is happening. He stated that the chair needs to help keep peace and love continuing. He also suggested looking at the format and, if something is removed and later found to be working, it can be added back in.

John D.: Stated that the IP gives good fundamentals to begin the conversation.
