Guy: Thank you for allowing me to be a part of service in this Area. I am here looking for solutions, and I want to jump in and get into solution-focused work. PR is very important. Our job is to inform the public that we are here and that we are a resource and a community. This helps bring addicts to us who may not know we are here.

PR is important because we need to be present in the public so others know where to get help. I have always liked the process of PR. I have held many positions in NA throughout my recovery, but I really love PR because it helps people know that we are here. I will also be getting with H&I to make sure we are not going to the same places.

Treehouse Check Discussion:

Jessica: I need to locate the check to Treehouse. Trent remembers giving cash to Treehouse, but the check has not been cashed. Josie brought up the option of having the bank cancel the check, as long as we are sure Treehouse received the money. There is a check that was written on March 8th, and I am not sure how to handle it at this point.

Trent: I remember who I gave it to, and it was not Molly. There was no receipt. Let me check with Molly again.

Jessica: I am going to highlight it, and it will be included in the financial report. Please be aware that it will be highlighted in yellow.

Josie: I asked about the church requesting a donation.

OPEN FORUM:

Increasing Meeting Support and Community Outreach:

Summary:

The Area discussed concerns related to low meeting attendance, limited home group support, and the need to create a more welcoming environment for newcomers, individuals from treatment centers, and sober living residents. Members shared ideas including workshops, outreach to sober living homes, distributing schedules and pamphlets, encouraging attendance across meetings, and exploring whether PR could help organize an informational event with treatment and sober living providers.

Mo: There has been a lot of discussion at Region about how to generate support. How do we create a welcoming environment that encourages people to show up? I know we have challenges in our Area because we have a lot of treatment centers and sober living environments. There has to be a way to present Narcotics Anonymous as welcoming and supportive. I think we are rock stars, and I wanted to put that out there for discussion.

Guy: Back home in Michigan, we did a workshop/activity together, and a lot of treatment centers came to that. We need some way to get the message to people.

Mo: I know we just lost a meeting, and we have meetings that do not have enough home group members. We also have meetings where only four or five people are showing up. I know there are a few days where there are two meetings happening. Would it be helpful to look at combining meetings?

Karen: The Wickenburg meeting is out there. My friend in Arkansas was doing something called "capture the flag," where each meeting came up with its own cloth flag. It encouraged people from different meetings to attend other meetings. I will touch base with her to see how it went and whether it is still going. Their meetings are also spread out. When my friend talked to me about it, she said it was a lot of fun and there was good participation.

Britney: Mo, you mentioned combining meetings that happen on the same day. The reason we started Instant Gratification was because B&G was at full capacity. We were driving from Prescott only to be turned away. Instant Gratification was the solution to that. We would not care if treatment centers attended. There was a treatment center there today, and it was very lively. Sometimes I question whether it was even worth it, because it is discouraging when you try to find a solution to the problem and still do not feel supported. We are still spreading the message that we are here and need support.

Kevin: Going back to something Guy said, sober livings may be a good place to connect with because they have more availability to go to meetings. They are required to attend a certain number of meetings each week. Oxford House has a once-a-month meeting at Safe Harbor, and we could possibly send a liaison to hand out pamphlets and encourage people by getting information out there. We have a website, but if you do not blatantly tell someone, they may not know. That may be a suggestion.

Sean-Michael: If we approach Oxford House, is that promotion? I am in favor of it, and I lived in Oxford House and had to go to meetings. I love the idea, but I want to make sure that as an Area, we are talking through everything.

Janet: Greg mentioned something at the Luau. What did Greg W. say?

Trent: Do not shove it down their throat. You can ask, "Do you want to try this?" All you can do is ask the question.

Karen: Promotion is talking it up and trying to convince someone. If you are just handing out schedules or pamphlets, it is factual, and we are simply saying we are here. That is not promotion.

Mo: Because we are so inundated with sober living homes and treatment centers, is this something PR could formulate into an event where we have a sit-down with those who own or operate these establishments?

PR Literature Request – Camp Verde Connection Center:

Janet: This is slightly off subject, but related to PR. I need more IPs for our Connection Center in Camp Verde. Should I put that in as a motion?

Trent: I have a bin full of IPs, so I will get you some.

H&I Panel Requirements Discussion:

Summary:

The Area discussed whether H&I panels should continue requiring two members or consider allowing one member to attend in order to increase coverage. Concerns were raised about safety, facility staff responsibilities, insurance/liability, and the importance of carrying a clear NA message. The topic will be taken back to home groups for further discussion.

Kevin: Yavapai Area is the only Area that is required to have two people going into H&I panels. Everyone else allows one person in order to get more coverage. Is that something we could also consider doing?

Mark: I talked to Bailey and Annette, and it would require a guideline change. Because of fights that have happened in rehabs, we require an extra person. I personally agree with looking at this because we have a really hard time fulfilling commitments. If there is a BHT present, there should not be an issue. We will talk about it at the next H&I meeting.

Bobby: Has anyone ever witnessed a fight?

A couple of members stated yes. It was discussed that staff was not present during those incidents, and that it is the responsibility of facility staff, not NA members, to break up fights.

Karen: Having worked in insurance for many years, our members should not engage in fighting. Our members need to speak with facility staff and work something out to make sure staff are present. This also helps prevent fingers being pointed at us.

Shelby: I thought the purpose of having two people go in was so that one person does not represent NA as a whole.

Vincent: My understanding was that the purpose was to make sure a clear NA message was being delivered. Everyone going into facilities needs to be carrying an NA message. This is something the Area would have to discuss.

Kevin: It would be nice to have two people, but sending one person in may not be a bad idea. There are places that want us there, but we have not been able to make it in due to lack of people.

Jacob: A lot of people on the H&I panels have a year or more of clean time.
